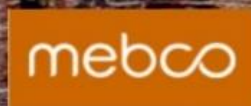

During the morning of **1st June** the focus of the Conference will be on Social Dialogue/ Collective Bargaining discussed from a sectoral perspective. This session will explore how social partners (trade unions & employers' organizations) or public private providers develops schemes to address the challenges of new forms of employment (e.g. part-time work), trends on mobility of workers, etc.
